# **Impact of Low Voter Turnout in Rajasthan Elections : Ministerial Heads to Roll?**



The recent elections in Raiasthan have seen a lower aiming to ensure maximum voter turnout compared to the 2019 Lok Sabha elections. Out of the 200 assembly constituencies in the state, only 175 witnessed a decrease in voter participation compared to the previous elections.

This trend has raised concerns among political circles, particularly regarding the performance of key leaders and ministers.Traditionally, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has placed significant empha-
