

"Aashadh Ka Ek Din": A Timeless Tale of Love and Sacrifice

Udaipur: The Natyaansh Society of Dramatic and Performing Arts recently staged the iconic Hindi play "Aashadh Ka Ek Din," directed by Amit Shrivastava and written by Mohan Rakesh.

This play, written nearly six decades ago, remains as relevant and impactful today. While it appears to be a love story between the Sanskrit poet Kalidas and his beloved Mallika, it also critiques power-drunk capitalists and highlights issues in the education system and bureaucracy.

Synopsis: In a Himalayan village under Ujjaini state, Kalidas and Mallika share a deep, selfless love rooted in their childhood friendship and love for literature. Despite Kalidas's reluctance to leave the village, he is persuaded by



Mallika to accept an invitation from the king of Ujjaini to become a court poet. Kalidas's friend Vilom and Mallika's mother, Ambika, encourage them to marry, but Mallika insists their love needs no formal bond.

Years later, Kalidas, now married to a princess and governing Kashmir, returns to the village but does not seek out Mallika.

Despite her unwavering love, she refuses to leave her home or marry anyone else. When Kalidas finally visits Mallika, they realize it is too late for a fresh start as she is married to Vilom. Kalidas leaves, and Mallika is left alone, surrounded by his books.

Performance: The lead roles of Kalidas and Mallika were portrayed by Agastya Hardik Nagda and Harshita

Sharma, respectively, who captivated the audience with their performances. The supporting cast included Umang Soni as the uncle, Arshad Qureshi as Vilom, Urvashi Kanwarani as Ambika, Riya Nagdev as Princess Priyangu Manjari, and Yash Jain as Nikshap. Other notable performances were delivered by Neha Shrivastava, Khushi Negi, Divyansh Dabi, and Parth Singh Chundawat.

The backstage team contributed significantly to the success of the performance, with Yash Shakti handling music coordination, Rekha Sisodia directing music, Ashfaq Noor Khan Pathan managing lighting design and operation, and Yogita Sisodia overseeing makeup and costumes.

Current Situation: 8 children and 6 adults dead in Gujarat, 27 suspected cases in 12 districts after screening 8500 houses. Symptoms found in two villages in Khedwada block, Udaipur. Medical department alerted.

Symptoms: Fever, body ache, flu-like symptoms, diarrhea, vomiting, brain swelling, brain fever, severe headache, coma, death.

Prevention: No vaccine available. Maintain cleanliness, use phenyl for cleaning, sanitize hands, use tissues when coughing/sneezing, avoid close contact with flu patients.
