## Mohanlal Sukhadia Memorial Lecture 2024 : Inspiring the Youth for a Progressive India

**Udaipur:** Shri Jagdeep Dhankhar, the Hon'ble Vice President of India, delivered the prestigious Mohanlal Sukhadia Memorial Lecture at the Vivekananda Auditorium, Mohanlal Sukhadia University (MLSU), Udaipur. - Launch of metro rail services every two years.
- Daily construction of 28 kilometers of national highways and 12 kilometers of railway tracks.
- Integrating 500 million people into the banking system over the last decade.
- Leading the world in digital transactions, surpassing the U.S., U.K., France, and Germany.

He affirmed that India is on track to become the third-largest economic power and called for the youth's collective effort to maintain and accelerate this momentum.
