The laboratory now

Dr. Mathur's leadership has also been pivotal in addressing critical gaps in specialized medical services. His efforts have facilitated the introduction of free AV fistula surgeries and plastic surgery treatments at RNT Medical College under the Chief Minister



Ayushman Health Insurance Scheme. These services now provide much-needed relief to dialysis and plastic surgery patients, reducing the need to travel to distant hospitals.

By prioritizing the appointment of specialist doctors, Dr. Mathur has ensured that departments like nephrology and plastic surgery, previously vacant, are now fully operational. His commitment to improving patient care has

## Successful Treatment of Complex Disease "Diaphragmatic Hernia"

**Rajsamand:** A 4-day-old newborn suffering from a rare congenital disease, Diaphragmatic Hernia (CDH), has successfully undergone surgery at the Gastro Surgery Department of Ananta Hospital.

Executive Director Dr. Nitin Sharma shared that the parents of the newborn had visited several hospitals, but the disease could not be diagnosed. When the baby was brought to Ananta Hospital, gastro surgeon Dr. Hemant Jain con-



ducted tests and diagnosed the baby with Diaphragmatic Hernia. This is a congenital defect where a hole forms in the diaphragm, the muscle that aids in breathing, allowing abdominal organs such as the stomach, spleen, liver, and intestines to move into the chest cavity. This leaves very little space for the lungs to grow and develop.

The parents were informed that surgery was the only solution for this disease. After the successful operation, the baby was discharged in healthy condition.

## Prakhar Singhvi Makes History in the World of Mathematics

**Udaipur:** Prakhar Singhvi, a brilliant student from St. Gregory Senior Secondary School, has made history in mathematics by securing a perfect score in the Copernicus Math Olympiad, earning the prestigious International Rank-1. This outstanding achievement has earned him the chance to represent India in the global round with a 6-day sponsored trip to New York.

While working on a mathematical research paper, Prakhar developed a groundbreaking theory that can determine any polynomial through just two factors, which will soon be published. His achievements prove that India's youth can excel globally in mathematics.
