Six-Year Journey of Selfless Meal Service in Udaipur

Udaipur: What began in 2015 as a personal effort by social worker Ashok Pokhara, using a tenth of his income to feed the needy, has now grown into the Nishulk Bhojan Vitaran Seva Sansthan — a fully operational institution that has completed six years of dedicated service. Initially distributing dal and puris at temples, Pokhara's turning point came in 2017 after witnessing hungry patients and attendants at MB Hospital. Deeply moved, he began offering bread, snacks, and water. In January



2018, he started distributing 50 meal packets every Sunday. Despite early criticism, his passion never faltered. Advocate Basant Bhatt offered initial support, and the first organized largescale meal service was held on April 28, 2019. Today, the organization feeds around 300 people daily. With support from MB Hospital and Dr. Vipin Mathur, it received dedicated premises in the hospital 18 months ago. Over 1.83 lakh people have benefited since.

Meals include rotis, vegetables, rice, khichdi, and special items during festivals. The team has also installed and repaired water coolers and organized seven blood donation camps. At a recent event, Dr. Mathur lauded the institution's work, calling it a beacon of compassion and a source of pride for the
