Dr. Girija Vyas: A Beacon of Graceful Leadership

BJP-Backed Employees Union Protests Inequality in Summer Timings at MLSU

SFAB Non-Teaching Staff Demand Uniform Office Hours, Citing Health Risks and Discrimination

Udaipur: Awave of protest has emerged at Mohanlal Sukhadia University (MLSU) as the contractual non-teaching staff represented by the SFAB Employees Union, affiliated with the Bharatiya Mazdoor Sangh (BMS)—the labor wing of the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)—strongly opposed the newly imposed summer office timings. The union has alleged discrimination and administrative negligence by the university.

According to University Order No. F6(251)/Adm/2025/1390 dated May 3, 2025, SFAB non-teaching staff were directed to work from 8:00 AM to 3:00 PM until further orders, due to the ngoing severe summer heat. However, as per another uni versity order dated April 22, 2025 (No. F71/Adm/2025/3126), permanent non-teaching staff were granted reduced timingsfrom 8:00 AM to 1:00 PM—for the same duration.

"This dual policy is not only unfair but life-threatening," said a senior member of the SFAB union. "Our duties and responsibilities are the same, yet we are expected to endure harsher working conditions.

The union, backed by BJP's labor organization, has submitted a formal protest to the university registrar and is demand-



The Prime Minister noted that initiatives like the Khelo India Youth Games, University Games, Winter Games, and Para Games are offering athletes consistent opportunities to showcase their talent. These regular national-level competitions have bolstered the confidence and performance of Indian sportsper-

Citing the success story of Bihar's young cricketer Vaibhav Suryavanshi in the IPL, the Prime Minister stressed that frequent match experience is vital for growth. He encouraged all participants to learn from the experience of playing at the national level.PM Modi reiterated India's aspiration to host the 2036 Olympics and spoke about how the government is nurturing talent from the school level through schemes like Khelo India and the Target Olympic Podium Scheme (TOPS).

He shared how indigenous games such as Gatka, Kalaripayattu, Kho-Kho, Mallakhamb, and Yogasana have been integrated into mainstream competitions, alongside emerging sports like Wushu, Sepak Takraw, Lawn Bowls, and Roller Skating. On infrastructure, he pointed out that the sports budget has tripled in the past decade, reaching ₹4,000 crore this year. Bihar alone has over three dozen Khelo India centres, with a State Centre of Excellence in Rajgir and infrastructure projects like Sports City on the Patna-Gaya highway. Bihar Sports University and the State Sports Academy are also enhancing athletic training and development. He underlined the rising opportunities in sports-related careers such as physiotherapy, data analytics, broadcasting, e-sports, event management, and sports entrepreneurship.
