

District Collector Reviews Progress of Public Welfare Schemes

Udaipur: A high-level district review meeting was held under the chairmanship of District Collector Namit Mehta on Wednesday through video conferencing. The meeting focused on the progress and implementation of various public welfare schemes, with strict instructions to officers to expedite pending matters and pursue developmental tasks in mission mode.

Food Security and Poverty Eradication: Collector Mehta directed officials to resolve all pending applications under the Food Security Scheme within 15 days. District Supply Officer reported that out of

17,306 applications under NFSA Phase II, 9,472 have been approved and 45 rejected. Under the Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay Poverty-Free Village Scheme, 122 villages and 832 BPL families were identified. SDMs were asked to personally verify these lists. Campaigns and Conservation Efforts: Special focus was laid on implementing the 'Karmabhoomi to Matribhoomi' campaign and initiating water conservation steps. SDMs were instructed to prepare action plans for water recharge, develop pits near handpumps, and conduct awareness programs with

stakeholders.<

Public Grievance Redressal: Emphasis was laid on timely disposal of complaints on the Sampark Portal, especially those pending beyond 30 days. SDMs were also asked to strengthen grievance redressal systems at village and block levels and submit fresh land allocation proposals if any.

Preparations for International Yoga Day: Preparations for June 21 Yoga Day with the theme "Yoga for One Earth, One Health" were discussed. The District Panchayat CEO will serve as the nodal officer, and practice



sessions are to be completed by June 20.

'Hariyalo Rajasthan' and Monsoon Preparedness: A target of planting 38 lakh trees

was announced. SDMs were instructed to finalize sites and ensure nursery stock. For the monsoon, tehsil-level control rooms will be set up by June

15, with flood mock drills, equipment inspections, and disease control plans in place, especially in sensitive zones like Jhadol, Kotda, and Girwa.

Aravalli Revival and Biodiversity Workshop Held

Udaipur: A national-level workshop was held at Hotel Radisson Blu to address the revival of the Aravalli landscapes and biodiversity conservation. Union Minister for Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Bhupender Yadav, inaugurated the event and emphasized the collaborative role of the central government and the four states—Rajasthan, Gujarat, Haryana, and Delhi—in ensuring a sustainable future for the Aravalli range.



In attendance were Rajasthan's Environment Minister Sanjay Sharma, MLAs Tarachand Jain and Phool Singh Meena, Ministry Secretary Tanmay Kumar, Director General of Forests Sushil Kumar Awasthi, and top forest officials from all four states.

Minister Yadav highlighted Aravalli's expanse across 29 districts, noting its historical, spiritual, and ecological value—from Haldighati to Ambaji. Despite facing pressures from population growth, illegal mining, and encroachments, he called for community participation and inter-departmental coordination. He planted a sapling in support of the "One Tree in Mother's Name" campaign initiated by PM Narendra Modi.

Rajasthan Minister Sanjay Sharma shared that under the "Hariyalo Rajasthan" campaign, the state surpassed its 70 million sapling target last year and has now set a goal of planting 100 million trees, with a three-tier audit system involving government and private agencies to ensure survival.

The workshop also launched the Aravalli Green Wall Project, creating a 5-km ecological buffer on both sides of the range to promote moisture retention, biodiversity, and climate resilience. Panel discussions featured presentations by forest officials from all four states, with suggestions such as easing tree farming norms and encouraging bamboo cultivation to boost afforestation and livelihoods.

The character she plays holds up a mirror to her inner self, awakening long-suppressed confidence and clarity. Her dull, routine life begins to bloom with purpose and presence.

Mansha Pasrija delivered a stellar dual performance as both Vijaya and Amrita, bringing nuance and emotional depth to each transformation. Ravi Bhushan stood out as the sensitive, emotionally torn father, while Dil Dilawar, playing the irreverent and irresponsible brother, added a touch of well-timed humor.

Though AI initially seemed alien to her, Shaniya enrolled in SAKSHAM and excelled. She landed a customer support job at ATS Mohali and later joined Neurica Technology with a 35% salary hike.

Similarly, Diksha, from Chhakoh village, emerged from a humble farming family with a firm belief in education. Her journey through the AI course at SAKSHAM taught her more than machines — it gave her a vision for a better future. Today, she works as a Visa Filing Officer at Aerial Telecom Solutions Pvt. Ltd. in Punjab.

Their achievements highlight a larger national shift. On National Technology Day, Prime Minister Modi emphasized technology's role in India's self-reliance. Shaniya and Diksha embody this spirit, showcasing how tech access can bridge regional and gender gaps. Since inception, Adani SAKSHAM has trained over 1.85 lakh youth across 40 cities in 15 states, contributing over ₹479 crore annually, proving its impact as a true force multiplier.
